It gets even bigger when they help us win a championship. There is one who has done more for us than any teammate. What He has done is greater than any championship. He continues to help us out in our everyday life. Are you saying, "Thanks, I am glad to be on Your team?"

There will be moments and situations when we need to look directly to Him for direction. He has promised to help us. Where do you look for direction?

Some coaches will try to teach their players to cheat in ways they won't get caught. When they are caught, they just say they were trying to win. When this translates into society, people feel free to break laws if it benefits them. This can easily lead to chaos. As a Christian, we should put our confidence for success in the Lord and obey His word. Are you living in such a way that God can bless you?

THEME: Say No To Discouragement

All athletes, in the midst of a tough game or a string of losing, must battle with discouragement. When you are discouraged, you have less energy and motivation because you have lost hope. Many times we would look for something good to happen to regain our courage. Instead of looking to outward circumstances, Christians should look to God for encouragement. Knowing that He loves us and will never leave us should give us courage to go on. When we have our hopes in Him, He gives us courage. Are you looking to circumstances or God for hope for the future?



When you sing a song to God does it reflect how you feel about Him?

In our daily lives, we should also choose our words carefully. God's word is full of encouragement and is able to give us purpose for our daily lives. When we neglect to remember His words, we go out and live without much enthusiasm. Trouble lurks for us. Are we facing each day with the encouragement of God's word?

For us to do the wrong thing leaves us without excuse. Are you trying to make excuses or are you accepting responsibility for your actions?

Whether it's their size or skill level, they can try to act brave, but a wise team will seize on this intimidation and attack. When Satan sees who is walking with us, he is intimidated. What he has learned is sometimes we forget who is with us and we approach life discouraged. In those moments, he steals victories that should have been ours. Are you walking in the confidence that the presence of God is in your life?

It can cause us to believe we have failed when the initial circumstances aren't favorable. Perspective tells us that initial circumstances don't always dictate the results and we should continue. Fear wants us to quit. Are you trusting in God even when things aren't looking good?

God, in these verses, is asking why do people pretend to be Christians when they don't pay any attention to what He is asking them to do. God has no patience for this type of living. Are we obeying God before we try to teach others?

Knowing what our limits are and what our gifts are, are the key to our lives. Are you trying to do something that only God can do?

One of the requirements of a coach for his athletes is to follow all of his instructions. The two things an athlete can't do are talk bad about the coach and not obey his instructions. If an athlete fails at one or both of these, the coach will no longer try to make him a better player. Why would we think any less of God working in our lives. We should only speak well of someone we are trusting to help us. If we truly want help, we will follow the instructions we are given. God is willing to help you; are you willing to follow His commands?

Every team has somebody they rely on when the going gets tough. These are your star players. The other team knows who you are looking to, but they can't stop him. What a comfort to know they are constantly on your team and you know you can count on them. God fills the same role in our lives. He is constantly there for us. He looks out for us and protects us. When the going gets tough, we don't have to wonder who to turn to or where to look for help. He is already there for you. Are you relying on Him in your daily life?

Over time their performance goes down and most never are able to turn their lives around. Once we start down this road, we can't go back and undo the damage we have caused to ourselves and others. Are you living your life like there is no God?

Those moments in the heat of battle when we feel the other team has intentionally wronged us and gotten away with it, we are tempted to try to avenge our teammate. What normally happens is we are caught and our team is penalized. Then we are left with the frustration of our injustice and our attempt at vengeance that failed. There is a better way. When we have been wronged, we should appeal to a higher power. An attempt to get vengeance ourselves puts us in the role of playing God. We should leave vengeance in His hands and focus on living our lives. Have you surrendered your desire for vengeance to God?

This impacts their total life. No one is exempt from tragedy. But God promises that if we will cast our burdens on Him and live according to His principles, He will help us get through the tough times. Now is the time to put your trust in Him before tragedy strikes. Are you trusting Him today?

As Christians, we have a place to turn to when the situation gets dangerous. We can turn to God. He is near and He is watching out for us constantly. When the going gets tough, where do you turn for help?

God asks the very same question. He expects you to have enough love for Him to obey Him. God is asking you today, "Are you listening?"

As a Christian, we should know that God is there for us and that the worst thing the devil can do is to cause us to lose our physical life. No one can take our salvation away from us. We should never panic or act in fear because; what is the worst he can do?


GOD THOUGHTS:

Are you focused on being who God made you to be?

No one wants a teammate he can't count on to do what they promise to do. Unreliable players don't last long. As Christians, we should be careful about making promises to God. Only make promises you can keep. How foolish is it to make promises to one who knows everything if we don't intend to keep them. Making a promise and keeping it is a path to blessing. Do you keep your word?

When a person complains they are focusing everything on themselves and not thinking about the other players or the fact that the job of the coach is to help them win. They must trust the coach to do what is best for the team. When it comes to our relationship with God the same is true. God is more interested in our character than our comfort. When we complain we are saying that God is not doing what is best for us. We need to trust Him. Are you complaining about something in your life?

However if they choose to not follow the coaches instructions or the game plan they are given they can limit their team because they no longer are following the same game plan. Even as Christians when we choose to not follow God or work with other Christians we can limit both God's blessings to us and His work in other peoples lives. Are you limiting God?

When this happens their team suffers from them not filling the role their team needs. They are absent even when they are there. As Christians we all will face challenging moments and will have to decide what to do. For some the pressure of the moment or the fear of failure causes us to shrink back instead of step up. We should take courage from the fact that our God will always show up and take charge of the situation. Are you trusting in God when the going gets tough?

This gives you credibility when you speak. People will respect and follow your integrity. To influence people your life should relect exactly what you say. Then people will follow you. Do you practice what you preach?

Are you loyal to Jesus?

We have all wronged Him and disobeyed His rules. If we will come to him and admit and wrongs and ask Him to, He will forgive us. Will you ask God for forgiveness?

This means saying not to your flesh and listening to the Lord. To live according to your emotions (flesh) only leads to problems. Are you living wisely?

For an athlete one of the keys to success is to eliminate distractions. If a professional athlete spend his time playing video games instead of practicing his sport his play would deteriorate. People would think it foolish to waste time on something that wouldn't help them be successful at their chosen sport. This is a perfect mirror for the follower of Christ. If we want to follow Christ we can't be chasing other things. These things will lead us away from God. What distractions do you need to eliminate?

Another key to success for an athlete is respect for their leadership. When a team or even a player loses respect for their coach their level of performance will drop dramatically. This is not an easy situation to fix. Without respect for their leadership a team will drift instead of following a set path. As a Christian we all have a set path that God has chosen for us to follow. That sometimes includes us following human leadership that he has established. When we lose respect for them we suffer and the work of God suffers. Do you have respect for your leadership?

A well-liked athlete talks about his team and focuses on helping his team do better. A true follower of Christ will always speak of the things of God and keep his focus on helping others to follow Him. Is your focus more on Him or on yourself?

Ultimate freedom comes from living within the guidelines He has given us. When we get off His path we get into trouble. Are you living in freedom?

Their only hope is to intimidate you into handing them a victory. Have you been intimidated by the world?

In order to protect the team a player who won't obey the rules is often asked to leave. A Christian should understand the power of rules as well. They protect his family and himself from the consequences of evil. Are you living by the rules that God has given you?
